settling in & stepping up

On the backside of COVID and the start of new grant projects, 2023 was a time of both **settling in** and **stepping up**.

New project coordinators Jermois Morris and Celia Richmond **settled in** to the team this year, becoming cross-trained on prevention and recovery related efforts.

Finally fully staffed, the Coalition stepped up its direct prevention services. We strengthened community ties and more meaningfully participated in shared efforts around addressing root causes and consequences of substance misuse—behavioral health, criminal justice reentry, and youth wellbeing.

CARE was also charged with **stepping up** to develop recommendations for the local use of national opioid settlement funds. Coalition staff took the lead on helping community members understand the process for using those funds and managing

compliance with state reporting requirements.

Meanwhile, CARE's jail-based program, in partnership with Transylvania County Sheriff's Office, settled in to a compassionate, yet efficient, rhythm. Staff integrated their processes, referral methods, and community contacts into an effective workflow. Meeting daily with detainees, CARE's jail-based staff not only changed lives, but made waves and turned heads—receiving lots of positive media coverage and attention from decision makers at the local, regional, and state level.

They **stepped up** by lending technical assistance to other communities, taking on leadership positions with a revitalized reentry council, and advocating for resources that protect the health and lives of their justice-involved clients.

CARE Coalition is also honored to have walked alongside several new organizations **stepping up** around social determinants of health,



mental wellbeing, and community capacity in Transylvania County. The collaborative capabilities of of our community are more robust than ever. The coalition is part and parcel of these organizations—with many shared members and stakeholders. Indeed, the coalition relies on its partners to champion solutions and stay the course.

We now look to the future, with a focus on both sustainability and expansion of our work. Together, we are again **stepping up**, ready to face new challenges and imagine new solutions.

NC OPIOID SETTLEMENT ALLOCATION PROCESS

Transylvania County will be receiving \$5.8 million from the national opioid settlements over the next 18 years. CARE Coalition was recognized by Transylvania County government to lead the process for determining how to best allocate this funding.

Having led a county-wide needs assessment and strategic planning process, CARE staff worked to develop specific, evidence-based interventions that could meaningfully impact people's lives and create population-level change. We worked with a consultant to investigate interventions in similar communities, estimate cost-benefits and individual impact, and calculate sample budgets for seven different interventions.

CARE hosted a "Community Information Session" in November 2023 to share these recommendations with the public and then presented official recommendations to the Transylvania County Board of Commissioners in December 2023. The commissioners will decide which strategies to fund, and CARE will assist with developing a spending plan and reporting outcomes to the state.

OUTREACH & EDUCATION

- Developed and delivered educational training about substance use disorder to:
 - Transylvania County Sheriff's Office patrol and detention officers
 - SAFE, Inc. staff
 - RYSC summer program participants
 - Faith Missionary Baptist youth group
 - Non-profit roundtable
- Coalition Vice-Chair Jim Hardy developed and delivered an educational presentation on trauma and the brain.
- Partnered with TC STRONG to host a viewing of Screenagers: Growing Up in the Digital Age followed by a discussion to explore the impact of screens on families and youth.
- Partnered with TC STRONG and SparkPoint to contribute self-care bags to the Brevard College Psi Chi chapter's self-care event.
- Partnered with Transylvania County Schools to collect data on youth behavioral health and substance use.
- Sponsored 6 Behavioral Health Corner articles in the Transylvania Times. These articles aim to address cutting-edge topics in behavioral health, with a particular focus on substance misuse.
- Presented a Hidden in Plain Sight exhibit at National Night Out, which provides information to parents about signs of teen drug use.

YOUTH RESILIENCE

- Continued partnering with TC STRONG and SparkPoint to advise and support 8 chapters of our Voice of the Students youth coalition.
- Sponsored 13 teens to attend the Teen Health Connection's Leadership Summit in Charlotte, designed to help teens "find their power" and connect with other drug-free youth who are making a difference in their communities.
- Trained 2 staff in YMHFA (Youth Mental Health First Aid) and 1 staff in ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training).
- Sponsored 2 community youth events to engage Voice of the Student members.

NICOTINE

- Delivered the "Catch My Breath" curriculum to all Rosman Middle School health classes.
- Sponsored "Vape Educate" licenses for Transylvania County middle and high schools.
- Trained 2 staff in a nicotine prevention program and alternative to suspension program and 1 staff in a nicotine cessation program.
- In partnership with MountainWise and Healthy Communities, advocated for a Tobacco 21 resolution adopted by the Transylvania County Board of Health and the Transylvania County Board of Education.

TREATMENT & HARM REDUCTION

- Distributed 110 lockboxes and 188 disposal bags to community members and partner organizations.
- The jail-based reentry program submitted 64 applications for in-patient SUD treatment.
- Delivered educational training on Narcan administration and overdose prevention to Sharing House staff.
- Facilitated partnership between Blue Ridge Health, Sharing House, and DJ's Wish for Narcan distribution.
- Developed and distributed Law Enforcement Resource cards with information on recovery services to officers at the Brevard Police Department and Transylvania County Sheriff's Office.

UNDERAGE DRINKING

- Supported Brevard Police Department in completing compliance checks and follow-up support for businesses.
- Provided recommendations to Brevard City Council about best practices regarding the proposed social district.
- Distributed 94 bottle locks at community events.
- Provided education to parents via social media about keeping alcohol out of reach and how to have conversations about alcohol and underage drinking.

about the coalition

Our mission: Empower collaborative partnerships in Transylvania County to reduce substance misuse by promoting prevention, treatment, and recovery efforts among youth and adults for a vibrant, healthful community.

The CARE Coalition of Transylvania County works to change community norms, reduce access and availability of drugs and alcohol, promote recovery, and reduce harm. The coalition convenes interested community members, facilitates collaboration, and coordinates efforts between coalition members and existing local resources. Supported by paid staff, coalition membership includes representatives from 12 community sectors including healthcare, law enforcement, social services, education, faith, and business, as well as parents, people in recovery, and other concerned citizens.

The "real work" of the coalition is done in project teams that focus on access to care and services, policy and enforcement, community outreach, and education. These project teams focus on implementing evidence-based strategies to raise awareness of substance misuse, build protective factors for youth, and change policies and environments in Transylvania County.

CARE is funded through 2 federal grants: the Drug Free Communities (DFC) Program of the President's Office of National Drug Control and Policy administered by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Comprehensive Opioid Stimulant and Subtance Use Program (COSSUP) through the Bureau of Justice Assistance, as well as a Saving Lives from Opioid Misuse grant from the Dogwood Health Trust. In addition, Brevard ABC Board provides funds to support youth and family outreach. The value of in-kind support from our community partners and volunteers is valued at over \$300,000 annually. Transylvania Public Health serves as the coalition's fiscal agent.


